

Scores Used to Determine Proficiency — Per State and Federal Guidelines

preK3, preK4, Kindergarten	If the student receives a 1, 2 or 3 Oral proficiency level, they are to be classified as an English learner (EL). If the student receives a 4 or 5 Oral proficiency level – they are to be considered Fluent - not to be identified as an English learner.
1st Grade	If the student receives a 1, 2 or 3 proficiency level in either Speaking and/or Listening, they are to be classified as an English learner (EL). If the student receives a 4 or 5 proficiency level in BOTH Speaking and Listening – they are to be considered Fluent - not to be identified as an English learner.
2nd – 12th Grade	If the student receives a 1, 2 or 3 proficiency level in ANY domain/subtest: Speaking, Listening, Reading and/or Writing, they are to be classified as an English learner (EL). If the student receives a 4 or 5 proficiency level in ALL domains/subtests: Speaking, Listening, Reading, and Writing, they are to be considered Fluent - not to be identified as an English learner.
